I found these things cannot lie, and therefore I use these "tools" to determine what is truth. But warning the master of lies can employ a tool that is true and still use it in a lie. So you better know how to use your tools and how they work like all sea captains or pilot navigators as -they would never be without these items and in combination here used together as all of them are as navigational instruments.

Even thought political-religiously speaking the earth is a spinning ball going around the sun—which is ridiculous, we pretend the earth is a curved ball in theory. But in practice you Have not- and will not ever see a curved earth map which is accurate! All our real maps are flat. And the Globes are a decoration of the stupidity we are expected to believe and are just a big orb of impossible. But ask a sea captain or a over seas air pilot if his charts are flat and to scale accurate are ignoring any curvature. Yes they are! Because in reality earth is not curved sphere but a flat plane. We sail and we fly in straight lines not in arcs on a circle. Altitude is based on 0 at sea level. All Seas are 0!

We only use flat map charts (because they are scale accurate) and the single direction North a pointer on the compass and publications determining the relative direction of the sun rise and sun set given a position on a flat map. And moon rise and moon set and angle to the noon of day and noon of night. And Polaris triangulates. Altitude at Boston Harbor is the same Sea Level as in Miami Beach as Port Los Angeles and as is San Francisco by the bay. It has to be levels do not lie.

If the ocean is curved ball then we are sailing down hill all the time, (no matter the direction we choose) But we use a fixed point on the horizon and the direction to a North star that all other stars revolve around, east to west everyday. When the day starts our instruments of guidance are in the level and our gyroscopes are already running

-rigid in space and we and everything on our ship moves around the instrument fixed to maintain the start orientation. We determine our course from these facts. The earth is a plane and does not move for our instruments would indicate it if that were not true. Our tools are, A magnet/A bubble level/A magnetic compass A mirror/A triangle with 90 degree angle trigonometry A straight line/A circle/A light/A sharp knife A gyroscope/A turntable (merry go round) A flat map/A magnifying glass (distorts) a temperature/a loaded spring/a buoyancy a gas/a solid/a fluid/a volt potential/hot/cold a resonance/a induction/a wind/ a sail/ a wing a color/a flame/a spin/a pressure/a float.


The Earth's radius (r) is 3959 miles, based on numbers from Wikipedia, circumference $c = 2*\pi*r = 24,875.10$

We wish to find the height (h) which is the drop in curvature over the distance (d) Using the circumference we find that 1 mile has the angle $360^{\circ}/24$, $875.10 = 0.01447^{\circ}$

The angle is a = 0.01447°*distance

The formula $h = r*(1-\cos a)$ is accurate for distance so rotate the earth at the equator it turns the full circumference in 1 day. The full 24,859.734 miles around and by dividing the 360 degrees of arc we get = 69.0548 miles/degree of rotation in the day in 360 rotation in 1440 minutes a day = 0.25 degrees per minute

but we are curving 8.04 inches curve for 1 mile $5280 \times 12 = 63,360$ inches
